

UROC Blast At Nixon's Peace Pact

United Republicans of California (UROC) denounced President Nixon's "peace with honor" in Vietnam yesterday, calling the cease-fire agreement a "surrender of the luckless people of South Vietnam."

"Describing the end of hostilities in Vietnam as 'peace with honor' when all facts show it is surrender, is the height of hypocrisy and gross deception upon the American people," UROC's board of governors said in a resolution which passed unanimously.

REPARATIONS

The board of the volunteer political organization also criticized the Republican president for agreeing to \$2.5 billion "in reparations to North Vietnam disguised as reconstruction."

The ultra-conservative group also passed resolutions opposing Mr. Nixon's extension of credit to Communist countries and his actions to take power away from Congress.

RESOLUTIONS

Other resolutions passed by UROC at its quarterly board meeting:

- Urge the Legislature to rescind its ratification of the proposed U.S. Equal Rights Amendment, calling the

measure a "most dangerous attack on traditional American family life."

- Request that Mr. Nixon pardon Lieutenant William L. Calley, accused of war crimes at My Lai.

- Call on the state Board of Education to insert the creationist theory of the origin of life into social science texts.

- Support Governor Ronald Reagan's appointment of William P. Clark Jr. to the state Supreme Court. Clark has come under fire since it became public knowledge that he lacks a law degree.

- Criticize the size of the \$9.26 billion proposed state budget for 1973-74 and urge the legislature to enact "true tax reform" that would reduce overall taxation.
