WASHINGTON, Feb. 28 (Reus)—The American bombing North Vietnam last Decemic cost more than \$25-million day but was so precise that noi residents felt it safe to me out and watch the attacks military tarkets, a Defense partment official said today. The new estimate of the mbing costs was given to the cuse Armed Services Comtee by Dennis J. Doolin, a puty assistant secretary of fense for international serity affairs. The committe was considerg a number of resolutions bmitted by war critics last onth asking the Defense Dertment to provide figures on a cost, tonnage and casualties sulting from the heavy bombg in December and the lowerale attacks in early January. Mr. Doolin said that during a 17-day period from Dec. 17 Jan. 3, the cost came to \$425-llion. He said that the United ates lost 28 planes during at period, including 16 B-52 mbers and two F-111 fightermbers.
