

Some Conclusions

Editor — Several conclusions can be drawn from the astounding statement by Dr. Kissinger that the United States would not oppose a Communist-dominated Vietnam:

- The thousand-year-old drive of the Vietnamese to achieve national independence and freedom from corrupt, unpopular puppet regimes is a legitimate one. It is not part of a Communist plan of world conquest.
- Our intervention in the war was a colossal blunder. The six million casualties, the irreparable damage to Indochina and to the quality of life in the United States, and the spending of billions of dollars on death and devastation — all this was for nothing.
- The talk about "peace with honor" is a cruel hoax.
