## Cambodia War--Arms Aid Blamed

## Washington

Defense Secretary Elliott L. Richardson yesterday blamed the war in Cambodia on continuing shipments of Chinese and Soviet supplies from North Vietnam.

He said the key to ending the conflict was to dry up these shipments, and the U.S. was negotiating toward that end. He declined, however, to discuss negotiations or to say whether direct ap-
