Talks in Paris Are Concluded

American and North Vietnamese delegates yesterday completed three sessions of talks to "prepare a review" of the Indochina cease-fire.

Neither side gave any details.

U.S. Ambassador William Sullivan said at the conclusion of the meeting, "Each side presented its views and we have achieved what we came to do."

North Vietnam's Nguyen Co Thach was slightly sharper. He said that "the positions are different."

Thach continued to evade the question of a meeting between presidential adviser Henry A. Kisinger and North Vietnam's Le Duc Tho, who negotiated the cease-fire with Kissinger. U.S. sources have said that there is a written agreement to hold the mosting in Paris later. the meeting in Paris later this month.
