On Bombing

Stockholm

Premier Olof Palme and Foreign Minister Krister Wickman accused President Nixon yesterday of violating the Paris agreement by bombing defenseless refugees in Cambodia.

"One cannot win the confidence of people through violence," Palme said in a May Day speech in Stockholm with one of Prince Norodom Sihanouk's aides sitting beside him.

"Therefore we say: stop the bombing. Honor the Paris agreement. Let the country (Cambodia) decide its own future. There will be only suffering and no peace until the bombs stop falling."

Wickman said in his speech that the fighting in Cambodia would have been over but for the direct involvement of the U.S.

"On one side stands a liberation movement with popular support, on the other an isolated terror regime, led by Lon Nol. It is in support of this regime that bombs are falling over defenseless people in Cambodia," Wickman said.
