

# A Former POW Sues for Divorce

## Memphis, Tenn.

Navy Commander Raymond A. Vohden, a prisoner of war in North Vietnam for almost eight years, filed suit for divorce yesterday.

Vohden seeks custody of the couple's two children, as well as the family home and other property he contends his wife, Bonnye Jean Smith

Vohden, acquired with his funds during his confinement.

Prior to the Vietnam accord, Mrs. Vohden herself had filed a divorce suit in Arkansas seeking to dissolve the couple's May 7, 1960, marriage.

She dropped the divorce when Vohden, one of the first prisoners to be released by the North Vietnamese earlier this year, talked to her by telephone.

Soon after being reunited with his family, however, Vohden said he was unhappy with his wife's expenditures and the manner in which she was taking care of the children.

He later said he left home and moved to Memphis Naval Hospital after his wife told him there had been another man in her life during his years of confinement.
