

Condition of Bombing Probe

Saigon

The International Commission for Control and Supervision said yesterday it will investigate Provisional Revolutionary Government (Viet Cong) charges that U.S. planes have been bombing inside South Vietnam, but not until the Communists agree to widening air corridors for the commission.

One delegate, Indonesian ambassador H. R. Dharsono, said the commission will insist on air safety corridors five miles wide to reach the site of the alleged bombing about 80 miles north of Saigon along highway 13.

The PRG has charged that American planes bombed, strafed and rocketed areas across the border from Cambodia and in one attack killed 34 civilians.

The U.S. has denied the reports.
