Move to Rap Jane Fonda Rejected

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — A City Council committee has turned down a resolution that would have condemned actress Jane Fonda for remarks she made about Amrican POWs.

The council's state, county and federal affairs committee voted yesterday to kill a resolution by Councilman Arthur Snyder that accused the film star of characterizing returned POWs as "Tiars, hypocrites and pawns."

'Miss Fonda spoke to the committee and said her statements about POWs had been directed against the 'hand-picked few who participate in press conferences.''

A spokesman for the American Civil Liberties Union said such a censure would be unconstitutional and added that the council "had no right to intrude on anybody's beliefs."

Snyder denied a charge by the ACLU the resolution was an attempt to censor Miss Fonda First Amendment rights of free speech.
