

### California Board Finds Ex-P.O.W. Unfit for Duty

OCEANSIDE, Calif., July 11 (AP) — Lieut. Col. Edison W. Miller, a former prisoner of war who faces misconduct charges, was declared medically unfit for duty because of the injuries and the illness he suffered in confinement in a North Vietnamese prison, a Marine Corps spokesman said.

The Camp Pendleton Medical Evaluation Board ruled yesterday that Colonel Miller, 41 years old, of Tustin, should be discharged. A final decision will be made by a board in Washington.

Another former P.O.W. Rear Adm. James Stockdale of Coronado, Calif., has accused Colonel Miller and Navy Capt. Walter Wilber of Columbia Crossroads, Pa., with mutiny, aiding the enemy, attempting to cause insubordination and disloyalty among other prisoners, failure to obey an order, conspiracy and solicitation.
