Sihanouk, in North Korea,
Said to Reject U.S. Offers

TOKYO, July 22 (UPI)—Prince Norodom Sihanouk, leader of the Cambodian government in exile in Peking, said today that he would reject any solution proposed by the United States to end the fighting in Cambodia, according to a report by North Korea's Central News Agency.

Prince Sihanouk, in Pyongyang, the North Korean capital, reportedly called attention to alleged American plans to bring about a "reconciliation" in Cambodia through a coalition government, and if that did not work, "to impose on use an on-spot 'cease-fire' which will result in dividing Cambodia in two."

"This or that solution of the Cambodian question, which the U.S.A. and certain West and East European powers want to 'offer' the Khmer people like a poisoned plate is absolutely unacceptable," the Prince was quoted as having said.
