

Sen. Hughes Says Nixon Told Lie About Cambodia

Sen. Harold E. Hughes (D-Iowa) said yesterday President Nixon told an "outright lie" to the American people about observing Cambodian neutrality.

Hughes referred to the President's April 30, 1970, tele-

vised speech announcing the dispatch of American and South Vietnamese ground forces into Cambodia to attack North Vietnamese sanctuary areas.

Hughes made his comment in an interview with Sen. Adlai E. Stevenson III (D-Ill.) recorded for broadcast in Illinois.

The Iowa senator, a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, reviewed recent disclosures of secret bombings in Cambodia from March 1969 to May 1970 in raids identified to Congress as being in South Vietnam.
