## Cambodia

SAIGON — (UPI) — The Viet Cong warned yesterday that any move by South Vietnamese military forces into Cambodia to defend the besieged government of President Lon Nol could spark a general renewal of fighting in South Vietnam.

"We have no intention of allowing territory controlled by the (Viet Cong) Provisional Revolutionary Government to be used by the Saigon side to launch military adventures in Cambodia," said Col. Vo Dong Giang, deputy chief of the Viet Cong delegation to the Joint Military Commission.

The Viet Cong controls

The Viet Cong controls most of the area along the South Vietnamese side of the border with Cambodia. Any major move of South Vietnamese forces into Cambodia would have to cross through this Viet Cong territory, although South Vietnam does control Highway 1 from Saigon into Cambodia and it could airlift troops into Cambodia.

Giang also indicated in the weekly Viet-Cong news conference that if South Vietnam did attempt to send troops into Cambodia, the Viet-Cong would not intervene in Cambodia itself.

## SFExaminer Aug 5 197 Sihanouk, Red Envoy Confer

TOKYO — (UPI) — Prince Norodom Sihanouk, leader of the Cambodian government in exile, conferred with North Vietnamese ambassador Le Dong in the North Korean capital of Pyongyang, the North Korean news agency KCNA said yesterday.

Sihanouk is the nominal leader of the insurgent forces battling the troops of Cambodian President Lon Nol on the outskirts of PHnom Penh.
