

# *Bombers Will Stay In Asia*

HONOLULU — (AP) — American bombers will remain in Southeast Asia beyond the Aug. 15 deadline for suspending bombing but the bombers will not do "anything prohibited by law," the command of U.S. Pacific Forces said.

"What we leave there will depend on the action of the North Vietnamese and their posture and the degree to which they follow the Paris agreement," said Adm. Noel Gayler.

Gayler, in a rare news conference, said the continued presence of American bombers would be a deterrent to "North Vietnamese adventurism."

He said he knows of no plans to seek an extension of the deadline imposed by Congress. Unarmed and unescorted reconnaissance flights will continue, he said, "but we won't do anything that is prohibited by law."
