

Two Resign Over The Peace Prizes

Two members of the Norwegian Nobel Peace Prize Committee resigned yesterday in protest against the award of this year's prize to U.S. Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and North Vietnamese Politburo member Le Duc Tho.

Helge Rognliden, chairman of the Liberal party, and Helge Hovdhagen, a

former Center party representative, told parliament that they thought the committee's choice was a serious mistake.

This was the first time any member of the Nobel committee so openly disagreed with its choice. The five committee members are elected by the Storting (parliament) for six-year periods.
