

Mideast Example**U.S. Peace Call
Aimed at Hanoi****Saigon**

The United States, in an unusually strong attack on North Vietnam, called on Hanoi yesterday to follow the example of the Middle East and stop the fighting in South Vietnam.

The call, in a seven-page statement by the U.S. embassy in Saigon, was issued minutes after North Vietnamese and Viet Cong delegates walked out of two separate meetings yesterday morning on the cease-fire and the search for 1100 American servicemen missing in action.

"Peace can come to Vietnam as it has come to the Middle East but, as in the Middle East, both sides

most desire it and work in good faith to bring it about," the statement said.

The walkout stemmed from the insistence by the Viet Cong delegation to the two-party Joint Military Commission and by North Vietnamese representatives to the four-party Joint Military Team to put priority of discussion on the issue of diplomatic privileges.

Both the commission and the team are outgrowths of the Paris peace agreement, and have been negotiating on the armistice and the missing-men issue for the past 16 months.

On the battlefield, a North Vietnamese local offensive 25 miles north of Saigon
