# Vietcong Says U.S. Sends Vast Supply Of Bombs to Saigon

PARIS, Jan. 24—A Vietcong spokesman charged here today that since the signing of the 1973 Paris peace agreements on Vietnam the United States had introduced 1.5 million tons of bombs into Saigon-controlled territory.

The spokesman said that at the height of the war, 800,000 tons of bombs were dropped yearly on South Vietnam under President Johnson and one million tons under President Nixon.

The spokesman, Dinh Ba Thi, also charged that the Government of President Nguyen Van Thieu was run from the American Embassy in Saigon. More specifically, he said, more than 100 American C.I.A. agents were running a network of 14,000 South Vietnamese agents of the political police.

Mr. Dinh is interim head of the Vietcong's Provisional revolutionary Government delegation here in the stalemated political talks with Saigon. He spoke at a press conference

marking the second anniversary of the Paris agreements, which were initialled on Jan. 23 and signed on Jan. 27, 1973.

Among other things, the agreements stipulated that once the treaty was in effect, arms could be introduced into South Vietnam only on a basis of one-to-one replacement of those already in the country. In anticipation of this stabilization, the United States delivered a vast supply of arms.
