**U.S. Envoy Said to Protest
Swedish Criticism on Asia**

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 30—The United States Ambassador has reportedly protested an outspoken Swedish Government statement strongly criticizing American policies in South Vietnam and Cambodia.

The Foreign Ministry said Robert Strausz-Hupe, the Ambassador, met for 90 minutes yesterday with Sven Andersson, the Foreign Minister, in connection with a speech the Minister delivered Monday. In it Mr. Andersson said President Ford's proposal to increase mi-

litary assistance to Saigon and Pinom Penh would only add to human suffering and prolong the war.

The United States Embassy declined to comment but well-informed sources said the Ambassador had orally protested sections of the address that the State Department believed were one-sided.

Singled out was Mr. Andersson's charge that only the United States and Saigon were violating the Paris accords. He referred to violations by the other side as "alleged" and did not mention the presence of North Vietnamese troops in South Vietnam.
