lated among key presidential aides, the Subversive Activities Control Board would be empowered to declare subversive any organization it deems "violent action oriented," the Hatford Courant reported today.

According to the newspa-per, under the new order the power to declare a group "subversive" would be shifted from the attorney general to the board.

The Courant said an order is being prepared by Attor-ney General John Mitchell torney general has the power for President Nixon and is to name an organization subfor President Nixon and is being circulated in draft form by the "executive office of the President" to key aides for comment. The story did not identify the aides.

HARTFORD (Conn.) — The order proposed by (AP) — Under a proposed Mitchell would include any executive order being circucommission of acts of force or violence or other unlawful acts to deny others their rights . . . the unlawful damage or destruction of property; or injury to persons . . .

The board could also de-clare subversive any group which obstructs the "recruitment and enlistment serv-ice" of the military, the Courant said.

Congressional approval of the order would not be required.

Under present law, the atversive if he finds it to be "communist," "totalitarian," or "fascist." The proposed order would give this powers to the board.
