President Nixon met with 43 U.S. state and territorial governors in Washington today in a closed meeting. Governor David Cargo of New Mexico, who left the meeting before it ended, said that the President and the Secretary of State briefed the governors on U.S. operations in Indochina. The President and the governors then discussed student unrest. ... Gov. Cargo said that Vice-President Agnew took a strict line in discussing student unrest. He [Agnew?] said that we have to reestablish authority on the campus and that the anti-intellectual forces were in control, and until they were removed there would be no way to carry on a dialogue with the students or faculty.
