Reagan's Advice on 'Crazies'

Los Angeles

Governor Ronald Reagan urged members of his generation yesterday to try to understand and communicate with the "fine young people" who believe that American society is sick.

"I believe that for a longer period of time than we realize, too many of them have

been taught in thousands of social science courses not the way things are, but the way things are not," the Republican chief executive told the Los Angeles Rotary Club.

Although they may agree with many of the aims of the campus radicals and revolutionaries — "the crazies" again called them — these

young people are shunning violence, said Reagan.

He said he is optimistic about prospects for peace on California college and university campuses this year because the "great silent majority" of students and teachers is beginning to be heard.
