BALTIMORE, Aug. 12 — The Black Panther party and a white lawyer awaiting retrial on accessory-to-murder charges filed suit against four Baltimore officials today asking \$1-million in damages and an injunction against continued surveillance of the party.

The suit alleges falsified and perjured evidence in the recent trial of the lawyer, Arthur Turco Jr., who is accused of being an accessory to the 1969 torture-murder of a Black Panther suspected of being a police informant, his first trial ended July 3 with a hung jury. William M. Kunstler, Mr. Turco's attorney, said the suit would be followed by similar actions in other cities where there have been prosecutions of Panther party members and associates.

The suit was filed in Feder-
