**Subversive Activities Panel  
Takes 33 Groups Off List**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10—

The Subversive Activities Control Board has decided that 33 groups named on the Attorney General's list of subversive organizations no longer exist.

The board announced today that, in response to a Justice Department request, it had submitted reports finding that the 33 groups had all been defunct for at least 16 years. The House Committee on Internal Security has reported that, as of May 9, all but 13 of 283 groups on the list of subversive organizations no longer existed. On June 15, the Senate voted

to cut off all funds for the board, which has had virtually nothing to do in the last decade because of court orders restricting its activities. Funding for the board is now being considered by a House-Senate conference committee.
