Energy Coordinating Pact

Representatives of the U.S. and 11 other industrialized nations, meeting in Washington, agreed in principle on a plan to conserve and share petroleum supplies in the event of a new oil shortage. The group, an outgrowth of a February energy conference, proposed that the 12 take common measures to restrict oil consumption during a crisis, and that oil-producing members share their domestic oil production with the others.

'No-Knock' Measure Killed by House

In authorizing \$480 million for a three-year continuation of the Controlled Substances Act, the House repealed the 1970 drug-control law's most controversial feature — the no-knock provision which had permitted federal judges to issue warrants authorizing Justice Department agents to break into residences unannounced in order to make drug searches.

Telephone Plants Hit by Strike

Ten Western Electric Company plants in eight Midwestern and Eastern states were struct the International Brotherhood of Electric rejected as "inadequate" a settlement covering Teastern ny employee
