**Times Correspondent Gets  
Award From News Agency**

Third World Media News, a news service specializing in news of interest to minority groups, has presented an award to Earl Caldwell, a San Francisco-based correspondent for The New York Times, for his stand against the Justice Department in refusing to answer subpoenas before a grand jury.

The grand jury was investigating the activities of the Black Panthers, and Mr. Caldwell argued that disclosing journalistic confidences would destroy his ability to gather news in the future. In June, the Supreme Court ruled, 5 to 4, against him.

The news service also awarded a citation to The Times for supporting Mr. Caldwell in the case. The awards were made Friday.
