NYTimes DEC 2 3 1972 Reporter Loses in Attempt To Be Freed for Birthday

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 22 (AP)
—William T. Farr, reporter for
The Los Angeles Times, lost a
last-minute effort to be released from jail today, his 38th
birthday, and resigned himself
to remaining in prison over
Christmas.

While refusing to release
him, the state appeals court
kept his latest appeal of a
contempt-of-court conviction
under advisement. Mr. Farr has
been ordered kept in jail until
he discloses sources of a news
article written during the
Charles Manson murder trial.

Mr. Farr's attorney, Mark
Hurwitz, filed a new appeal
alleging that the indefinite
sentence given the reporter
was "tantamount to life imprisonment."

The court indicated it might
rule on that petition next
Tuesday, the first day it will
be in session after the Christmas holiday. The appeal raises
grounds not cited before—
notably, that the reporter may
be serving a sentence in violation of the constitutional ban
against cruel and unusual
punishment.
