LECILS F.B.I. to Let Rosenbergs' 2 Sons Take 30,000 Pages of Its Files

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17—The Federal Bureau of Investigation disclosed today that it would make available about 30,000 pages of documents on the investigation of Ethel and Julius Rosemberg to the couple's sons.

The bureau released the text of a letter written by the F.B.I.'s director, Clarence M. Kelley, to the attorney for Robert and Michael Meeropol, who filed a freedom of information suit to obtain all the Government's files on their parents' case.

In the letter, Mr. Kelley wrote that 28,438 pages would be available to the Meeropols, plus "at least 1,500" more pages referred to in the first documents. The charge for the documents, he wrote, would be \$23,451,80, to pay for the searches and there would be a charge of 10 cents a page for copying.
