"I am grieved at the loss of George Jackson, a courageous young black man who was committed to a life of freedom and justice for his fellow brothers," Dellums said in his letter to Thorne.

"His (Jackson's) understanding of the nature of racism and institutional brutality in San Quentin and other correctional isntitutions in this country reveals the need for immediate prison reform."
