Marin Asks Big Change at Quentin

Marin County supervisors want maxium security San Quentin Prison converted to a minimum security institufor less volatile convicts.

A resolution adopted last night declared the prison was antiquated, understaffed and burdened with physical and psychological conditions that contributed heavily to explosive conditions leading to the Aug. 21 bloodbath in which fied as it was never intended six men died.

Governor Reagan was asked to appoint immediately a committee to look into inadequacies in the State's San Quentin in particular.

The resolution came from the county's Human Rights Commission which had one of its own committees make an on-the-spot survey.

Assistant District Attorney Gary Thomas, paralyzed in courthouse shooting last year that claimed four lives, suggested the supervisors ask that the prison be reclassifor maxium security, hardened criminals.

Thomas' addition was accepted by the supervisors and added to the final resolupenal system in general and tion, adopted by the five supervisors without dissent.
