

Senate OK's Bill for Angela Trial

SACRAMENTO — (UPI)

— The Senate has passed a bill directing the state to pay the costs — estimated at \$1 million — for the trial of Angela Davis and Ruchell McGee, accused of murder and conspiracy in connection with Marin county shootout on Aug. 7, 1970. The measure by Assemblyman William T. Bagley (R-San Rafael) was endorsed, 28-0, and returned to the lower house for amendment concurrence yesterday.

Although the trial of Miss Davis has been moved to Santa Clara County, the state will still pay for the costs, Sen. Peter H. Behr (R-Tiburon) Senate sponsor of the bill, said.

They are charged with the jailbreak and subsequent shootout at the Marin Civic Center that took the lives of four persons, including Superior Judge Harold J. Haley.
