

Angela Davis Security Hit As a 'Stigma'

SAN JOSE — Angela Davis' chief defense counsel charged today that extreme security measures being taken by Santa Clara authorities are designed to "stigmatize Angela as being guilty before the trial starts."

Howard Moore Jr., who heads the defense team, also revealed that Miss Davis was hospitalized in Palo Alto for more complete tests involving her complaints of respiratory and other ailments.

The county has authorized expenditures of \$672,000 to pay for special security measures for Miss Davis' murder - kidnap - conspiracy trial scheduled to start later this month. The charges stem from the Aug. 8, 1970, shootout at the Marin County Civic Center.

The hospital tests were being conducted by Palo Alto physician, Dr. Russell Lee, who was appointed by the county to treat Miss Davis. Moore said results of the tests weren't expected until next week.
