
Murder Suspect's Real Name Revealed

San Jose detectives investigating the execution-style slaying of James E. Carr discovered yesterday that one of the two suspects in the case had been booked under a fictitious name.

The 28-year-old black man seized about a half hour after the shooting Thursday morning was originally arrested and booked under the name of Chester Duane Ligons. But yesterday investigators identified him as Lamarr Mims.

Mims, and Richard Rodriguez, 22, both from the Los Angeles area were arraigned in San Jose Municipal Court yesterday on

charges of conspiracy and first degree murder.

AMBUSHED

Carr, who would have been 29 yesterday, was ambushed Thursday morning outside the large rambling home where he lived with his wife, baby daughter, and a number of friends.

Dr. John Hauser, coroner-medical examiner, said Carr was killed instantly from gunshot wounds in the abdomen and the chest. Three rifle slugs and 20 shotgun pellets were removed from the body.

Rodriguez and Mims were arrested in Morgan Hill, 20 miles south of San Jose. Ar-

resting officers reported that when they stopped the two suspects, they found a .357 magnum revolver, a shotgun and a .308-caliber rifle, all loaded. And officers also found four fire bombs on the floor of the car.

BOOKED

Mims and Rodriguez were returned to San Jose for questioning and booking within hours of their arrest.

Carr's attorney, Richard Hodge of San Francisco, said yesterday he was shocked by his client's death, "but we knew for a long time that Carr was worried about violence being done to him."
