Angela Link With Carr Is Denied

The National United Committee to Free Angela Davis, yesterday denounced prosecutor Albert Harris and some journalists for trying to "railroad" Miss Davis by linking her with James Carr, shot to death outside his home in San Jose last week.

Charlene Mitchell, executive secretary of the committee, told a press conference that Miss Davis had never even met Carr.

"James Carr has never been associated in any way with NUCFAD (the commit-

tee) and he never had any personal contact with Angela Davis," Miss Mitchell said.

She also labeled as "an absolute lie" press reports that Miss Davis stayed at the home of Joan Hammer, Carr's mother-in-law, for the first few days after she was released on bail.

"Since October, 1970, we have said that the aim of the state's conspiracy against Angela Davis and other political activists is to behead and paralyze the growing movement for radical change in this country," she said.
