

Magee Trial In Marin Killings Set

Ruchell Magee's trial over the Aug. 7, 1970, Marin Civic Center shootout was set for May 22 during a hearing today at the shootout site.

Angela Davis, on trial in San Jose in the same case, attended the hearing.

Superior Judge Leonard Ginsburg of Tulare at first suggested June 12 but Magee protested:

"I can be dead by June 12 under certain conditions I am being held under (sic) at San Quentin where I'm subject to cruel and unusual punishment."

Judge Ginsburg took under submission Magee's motion to be transferred from San Quentin to the Marin County jail for the trial. Deputy Attorney General Eric Collins opposed the motion, saying Magee was too high a security risk.

Miss Davis stayed throughout the hearing, changing plans to divide her time between Magee's and a simultaneous hearing for six San Quentin convicts over the violence of last Aug. 21 at the prison in which six persons died. One was Soledad Brother George Jackson, for whom Miss Davis has professed a passionate love.
