## Trial of 2 Suspects in Carr Slaying

Why James Edward Carr was killed in violent ambush outside his San Jose home April 6 remains a mystery today.

But the municipal court judge found "sufficient evidence" yesterday to believe two Los Angeles men should be held for trial in the execution style murder.

Judge R. Donald Chapman ordered Lamarr Lloyd Mins, 21, and Richard Rodriguez, 22, held for arraignment Superior Court May 5 on charges of murder, conspiracy, and firebomb possession.

Assistant District Attorney William Hoffman who claims the 28-year old Carr was the victim of \$540 contract slaying, tried in vain to uncover a motive for the murder by asking Carr's widow, Besty, 20, to recall any reason for the death.

Mrs. Carr denied that her husband belonged to the Black Panthers, served as a Panther bodyguard, or had anything to do with reputed thefts of Soledad Brothers' or Angela Davis defense funds.

She admitted her husband knew Panther captain Amon Fred Bennett in San Francisco, during the summer of 1970 before he was slain, then dumped in a Santa Cruz mountain "bomb factory."

Her husband, she said, did not fear Bennett and expressed no fears for his life although two Molotov cocktails were found in hedges near their home three weeks before Carr's death.
