San Jose Municipal Court Judge Wayne Kanemoto yesterday sentenced 22 of the 24 protesters convicted of illegal picketing outside the Angela Davis trial last February 22.

The judge issued 30-day suspended sentences and placed the defendants on summary probation for six months.

Franklin Alexander, co-

chairman of the Angela Davis Defense Committee, was also found guilty of the misdemeanor charge, but he was not sentenced because he was out of town, according to his attorney.

Another of the 24, Paul Goadig, a 25-year-old premed student, is currently being tried on charges of destroying evidence and interfering with a police officer.

Thomas J. Ferrito, attorney for the group, said the sentences will be appealed to the Superior Court.

Those sentenced were charged with a section of the state's penal code which prohibits picketing or parading in or near a courthouse with the intention of obstructing justice or influencing a judge, jury, witness or officer of the court in the discharge of his duties.
