## 2 More Charges Against Newton

Two additional misdemeanor charges were filed against Black Panther leader Huey P. Newton and his bodyguard when they appeared in Oakland Municipal Court yesterday in connection with their alleged attack on a disc jockey.

Newton, 29, and bodyguard Robert L. Bay, 28, already were charged with battery and exhibiting a gun in a threatening manner on the complaint of Alonzo Miller, 29, who has a show on radio station KDIA under the name Marlon Scott.

Miller told police that Newton and Bay beat him without provocation as he sat in the Rainbow Lounge at MacArthur boulevard

and Broadway the night of April 16.

When Newton and Bay appeared before Municipal Court Judge Lewis P. May for arraignment yesterday, authorities filed two additional charges against each of the men: possession of a loaded gun and possession of a concealed weapon.

The charges stemmed from the arrest of Newton and Bay on the disc jockey's complaint April 16. Police said the arresting officers found a loaded 9-mm. pistol in an attache case in the Black Panthers' car.

Judge May agreed to a request by attorney Charles Garry for a postponement of the case until next Friday. Both defendants are free on bail.
