## NOSENKO CALLED SON **OF LATE SOVIET AIDE**

Special to The New York Times MOSCOW, Feb. 26—Usually reliable sources said Wednesday that Yuri I. Nosenko, the Soviet disarmament delegation member who defected to the Weit

that Yuri I. Nosenko, the Soviet disarmament delegation member who defected to the United States early this month, was a son of Ivan I. Nosenko, Min-ister of Shipbuilding until he died in 1956. The younger Nosenko' disap-peared in Geneva Feb. 4. Ten days later the State Department announced that the United States would grant political asylum to the 36-year-old of-ficial, whom it described as a member of the Soviet' secret police. The Shipbuilding Minister, who was named an alternate mem-ber of the Communist party's policy-making Central Commit-tee in 1952, was buried with honors in the Kremlin wall. He apparently played a key, role in managing Soviet industry in World War II and headed the Transport Machinery and Ship-building Ministries through a series of reorganizations in the postwar period. A shipyard was named for him in the Black Sea port of Kherson.
