IT IS UNDERSTOOD HERE THAT THE BRIDGE TARGET OF THE WOULD-BE SABOTEURS IS OVER THE KAFUE RIVER, 30 MILES SOUTH OF LUSAKA.

THE 1,398-FOOT BRIDGE IS THE LONGEST IN THE CENTRAL AFRICAN RAIL SYSTEM.
