

# Cubans Claim Arrest of 18 in Oil Spying Ring

The broadcast said those arrested had in their possession radios, transmitters, tape recorders, and code books to decipher messages. It said the alleged organizer of the ring, De los Angeles Suarez, and two other persons, arrested last week, added they were arrested in a convention of the Cuban American Congress in Miami. The organization was formed after their

arrest. The broadcast said those arrested had been turned over to the House's Resolution 1004 committee.

SENATOR FERNANDEZ said he had seen Can Chao, arrested last week from the spy ring, in Cuba. He said he identified supplies for the ring. It added that a radio, said the name of Can Chao at Boca Lupa, Havana suburb, was used to transmit and receive radio messages.

Among items seized from those arrested, it said, was special paper to be used with invisible ink. It said the group had the CIA information regarding oil supplies and ship movements, along with other data.

The broadcast described Fernandez Trujillo as unemployed and said Can Chao worked for the Cuban oil industry. The other persons arrested, they said, were "former members of the Batista regime and enemies of the revolution." Fulgencio Batista was ousted by Fidel Castro in 1959.

THE WOMEN arrested were identified as Ana Gloria Rodriguez Pereira, Yolanda Veiz Martinez, Magdalena Obie Vallescuat, Emilia Nunez Fernandez and Amparo Corzo.
