## Wife Advises Acquitted Hijacker to Avoid Planes

SAVANNAH, Ga., Nov. 21 (UPI)—Shortly after being ac-quitted in a trial yesterday on charges of air piracy, Robert M. Helmey was told by his wife that part of his rehabilita-tion program would be "stay-ing away from airplanes." The jury foreman, Herb Schafer, said that deliberations lasted "25 to 30 minutes at the most. It didn't take us long to make up our minds," he added.
