Kadafi announced in a speech in Tripoli Friday night that his government had crushed a plot led by prominent figures of the ousted monarchy.

He claimed the plot was hatched by the Seif Am-mannassr family, a powerful business family in the southern town of Lebha.

The agency said the plot-ters admitted to have planned to seize control of Sabha in southern Libya and proclaim a separate republic. The report said Western oil interests were involved.
