THE PLAINS, VA., (AP)-DESMOND FITZGERALD, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF PLANS FOR THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY, DIED SUNDAY. HE WAS 57. FITZGERALD, ONE OF THE MOST POWERFUL BUT LEAST PUBLICIZED OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, SUFFERED AN APPARENT HEART ATTACK WHILE PLAYING TENNIS AT HIS VIRGINIA HOME.

AN ATTORNEY, FITZGERALD JOINED THE CIA IN 1951 AND AFTER SERVICE IN THE PHILIPPINES AND JAPAN BECAME DIRECTOR OF LATIN AMERICAN OPERATIONS IN 1961.

A YEAR AGO, HE SUCCEEDED RICHARD HELMS WHO BECAME THE CIA'S TOP MAN. UNDER HELMS, HE WAS IN CHARGE OF THE OPERATIONAL SIDE OF THE AGENCY'S WORK, INCLUDING ITS CLANDESTINE ACTIVITIES. IN THAT POST, HE WAS CONSIDERED ONE OF THE MOST INFLUENTIAL BORN IN NEW YORK, HE GRADUATED FROM HARVARD AND DURING WORLD WAR LETI IN 4956. 1746.

HENTERED THE U.S. ARMY AS A PRIVATE. HE WAS A MAJOR WHEN HE COUNTRY HAS LOST A PROFESSIONAL INTELLEGENCE OFFICER OF HIGH INTEGRITY, SPECIAL ABILITIES AND UNCOMMON DEDICATION.
