Bob Kaufman, Black North Beach poet who is published by New Directions in New York and by City Lights in San Francisco, is in the Alameda County Jail at San Bruno, Branch 2, charged with illegal possession of a hypodermic needle. He is serving 90 days. Lawrence Ferlinghetti predicts "it will take Bob's death to get him recognized as maybe the greatest Black poet in San Francisco. Free Bob Kaufman!"

Organizers of a Regional Black Power Conference in Hamilton, Bermuda, charge that CIA men were all over the airport and the island. The British Government also sent 100 Royal Marines as "a kind of insurance policy in case of trouble."

The CIA has organized a group which includes Bolivian military personnel to kill Antonio Arguedas Mendieta, former Bolivian Minister of the Interior who turned over copies of Che Guevara's diary to Cuba. Bolivian criminal investigator A. Davila Torres said: "It is very likely that those who made the attempt on the life of Arguedas were CIA agents." Arguedas was wounded by a burst of machine gun fire from a moving car. It was the third attempt on his life.
