SEAMAN IN HIJACKING IS RETURNED TO U.S.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 19 (AP) —Alvin L. Glatkowski, one of two merchant seamen accused of hijacking the American arms ship Columbia Eagle to Cambo-dia last March 14, was returned to the United States Saturday. Glatkowski, 21 years old, of nearby Long Beach, was held at Los Angeles County Jail without bail. He has been in-dicted by a Federal grand jury here on charges of mutiny and kidnapping in international waters. 20 DEC

here on charges of mutiny and kidnapping in international waters. He surrendered himself this week at the United States Em-bassy in Pnompenh. He and Clyde W. McKay Jr., 26, of Es-condido, Calif. have been charged with having seized the ship about 105 miles off Cambodia. Robert Meyer, a United States attorney, said Glatkow-ski had been returned secretly by United States marshals to "maintain the safety of the prisoner." He refused to say specifically how Glatkowski had been transported, but sources said he had been. re-turned by airplane from Viet-nam. Glatkowski had been under
