Guilty Plea In Munitions Ship Hijack

One of two men charged in the hijacking of the munitions ship Columbia Eagle off the coast of Cambodia pleaded guilty yesterday and was sentenced to ten years in Federal prison.

Alvin Leonard Glatkiwski, 21, a seaman from Long Beach, pleaded guilty to munity and assault on the high seas.

The government said Glatkiwski and Clyde William McKay, 26, of Escondido, two crew members on the freighter, seized the shipby force last March 14 and ordered ti to Cambodia.

Glatkowsky and McKay claimed political asylum in Cambodia but Glatkowski later surrendered to the United States embassy there.

McKay is believed still in Cambodia.
