F. Edward Hébert, chairman of the House Armed Services Committee, has appointed an active antiwar Congressman, Lucien N. Nedzi, a Michigan Democrat, chairman of the House subcommittee that k eps an eye on the Central Intelligence Agency.

Why? "Because he's a good man, even though we're opposed philosophically," said Mr. Hebert, who instructed Mr. Nedzi "to make periodic inquiries into all phases of intelligence activities within the Department of Defense and within the agencies established under the National Securities Act."

Mr. Nedzi said that Mr. Hebert, a Louisiana Democrat, had placed "no restrictions of any sort" on him, even though he's been highly critical of the war in Vietnam and Pentagon policies.
