Ferdinand Simoneit, editor of the business monthly Capital, said that further research had cast "serious doubt" on the re-port that C.I.A. agents here had informed Washington that they believed that Günther Nollau, director of the federal Office for the Protection of the Con-stitution, might be an agent for East Germany. Mr. Uollau threatened to sue and he and the two govern-ments denied the report four days ago when Mr. Simoneit announced that he intended to publish it.

announced that he intended to publish it. ' "New information has cast serious doubt on the authentic-ity of the paper which was said to be a private study made by the C.I.A." Mr. Simoneit said. "Capital will not publish the article about Nollau."
