

Leland Bunn, Officer With CIA 27 Years

Leland Edward Bunn, 55, a retired CIA intelligence officer, died of a heart ailment Friday at Arlington Hospital. He lived at 4112 N. Richmond St., Arlington.

In 27 years with the CIA, Mr. Bunn served as an investigator and operations expert.

He acted as the agency's liaison officer with the White House, the FBI, the State Department, and other executive offices.

He was chief of the security management staff for the deputy director for science and technology. He provided operational support for agency activities in Europe while he served in Germany, providing liaison with local government and U.S. military officials.

A native of Wilson, N.C., Mr. Bunn moved to Washington and attended the Strayer School of Accounting here. He was a member of the Sharon Masonic Lodge No. 327; the Kena Shrine Temple in Alexandria; the Fort Myer Officers' Club; and the Memorial Baptist Church in Arlington.

He is survived by his wife, Euna Mae, a daughter, Brenda, and a son Nelson, all of the home; his mother, Suddie Bunn; a sister, Lucille B. Peacock, both of Falls Church, and three nephews.
