Mr. Allen, who is in charge of corporate planning for Glo-bal Marine, said that the ves-sel would leave her berth at Long Beach "around the end of the month" for a four-week cruise to an unspecified destination. He declined to state the purpose of the voyage, ex-cept to say that it was oc-casioned by "completion of modifications in the ship." The Glomar Explorer suf-fered breakdown of some equipment in her submarine re-trieval effort last August, dur-ing which she dropped the
